### **Update Note**

<u>Agenda Item 6 – Summary and Assessment of Bids for Funding from the Neighbourhood Proportion</u> of the Community Infrastructure Levy

Since the report was prepared there is an update to make Members aware of:

- Langley Primary school has submitted additional information to support their bid for £5000 to contribute to the repair of the school drive. Previously no details to evidence this request for funding was provided. The additional information demonstrates that the project is now deliverable and the project has subsequently been assessed against the agreed scoring matrix.
- The bid scored a total of 24 which is above the minimum criteria required and there are sufficient funds in the Olton ward pot for the project to be recommended for approval and funding.
